

GENERAL INSTRUCTION.

This Paper, except the compartments under the Royal Arms, to be filled up by the OCCUPIER or person in charge of the dwelling.

If a house is let or sub-let to separate Families or Lodgers, an OCCUPIER or LODGER must make a return for the portion of the Column headed "NAME, PROFESSION, or OCCUPATION."

INSTRUCTIONS for filling up the Column headed "NAME, PROFESSION, or OCCUPATION."

A person following more distinct Occupations than one, should insert them in the order of their importance.

- 1. THE SUPPER TABLES OF TERMS and the NAMES OF BANK TO BE EMPLOYED ON PARCELS, but not living in the SUPPER'S house, must be described as apprentices, laborers, workmen, &c.
2. MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT, MAGISTRATES, COUNCILLORS, and other important public Officers, to state their professions or occupations, in any line that they may follow, whether in the service of the State, or in the Army and Navy, to state their ranks and the branch of the service to which they belong.
3. ALL persons in the CIVIL SERVICE to state their rank, and the department or branch to which they belong; those retired or superannuated, to state their rank, and the department or branch to which they belong.
4. ALL persons in the MILITARY SERVICE to state their rank, and the department or branch to which they belong; those retired or superannuated, to state their rank, and the department or branch to which they belong.

TO THE OCCUPIER. This Paper will be CALLED FOR on MONDAY, April 3d, by the appointed Enumerator. It is to be filled up by the occupier of the house or other site, in compliance with an Act which passed the House of Commons in the Session of 1870.

Table with 10 columns: Name and Surname, Relation, Condition, Age (last Birth-day) and Sex, Rank, Profession, or Occupation, Where Born, and Number of Children.

NOTE.—Examples of the mode of filling up the Schedule are given in another part of this paper.
