SAMPLE assigns every sample in the NAPP database a unique code. The first three digits are the ISO country code; the last digit identifies the particular sample within the country.

The combination of SAMPLE, SERIAL, and PERNUM provides a unique identifier for every case in the NAPP database.

SERIAL: Household index number

SERIAL is an identifying number unique to each household in a given year and country. All person records are assigned the same serial number as the household record that they follow. (Person records also have their own unique identifiers-see PERNUM.)

SEQ: Index to distinguish between copies of households with multiple primary links

The variable PERNUM numbers of all persons within each household consecutively (starting from "1" for each household) in the order in which they appear on the original census form.

NAMELAST: Last name

NAMELAST is an alphabetic variable giving a person's full last name. It will primarily be of use to researchers linking the NAPP census data to other sources of demographic data, or researchers whose research topic involves naming patterns. Because of the length of this variable (32 columns), and the size of the dataset, other researchers should not select this variable.

NAMELAST is used to produce the variable SURSIM which assigns the same code to all persons within each household who had a shared surname.

NAMEFRST: First name

NAMEFRST is an alphabetic variable giving a person's full first name. It will primarily be of use to researchers linking the NAPP census data to other sources of demographic data, or researchers whose research topic involves naming patterns. Because of the length of this variable (32 columns), and the size of the dataset other researchers should not select this variable.

AGE: Age

AGE gives age in years as of the person's last birthday prior to or on the day of enumeration.

The Canadian 1881 census provides age in months (AGEMONTH), and birth month (BIRTHMO) for people under one year of age. The 1852 Canadian census reports age in months, weeks, and years. (AGEMONTH) is also available for the Canadian 1901 census and United States censuses.

Age has been topcoded at 125 in all the NAPP censuses except for the United States samples.

BPLCNTRY: Country of birth

BPLCNTRY provides information on the country where a person was born. It does not provide any detail on birthplace below the country level, except for some dependent territories. For example, the Faroe Islands can be distinguished from Denmark, but states in the United States or provinces in Canada cannot be distinguished. For detailed information on the country-level birthplaces,

refer to variables BPLPROCA, BPLDSTCA, BPLCTYGB, BPLIS, BPLNO, BPLSE, BPLPARSE and BPLUS. Users who are interested only in distinguishing countries of birth within the NAPP countries should use the variable NAPPSTER.

BPLCTYGB: County of birth, Britain

BPLCTYGB indicates the classified county of birth for those born in England, Wales and Scotland, if this is possible to determine from the given place of birth. It is an adaptation of BPLCNTRY with more details with respect to birthplace within Great Britain. For those who recorded a place of birth which is known to be in one of the constituent elements of the United Kingdom, this information is coded here as 990 for England, 991 for Wales, and 992 for Scotland. The Channel Islands are coded to the respective island as is the Isle of Man. Those born in the Isles of Scilly are included within Cornwall. Those people born in Ireland have been allocated the code 993 and all others (i.e., those born outside of Great Britain and the islands in the British seas have been classified here as "foreign" (code 998).

This coded variable is based on a series of algorithms acting on the uncoded original responses, and it is likely that there are some incorrectly coded countries of birth.

CFU: CFU index number

The CFU is the basis of the Hammel/Laslett household classification scheme. CFUs are formed in one of three ways: by a married couple without offspring; by a married couple with never-married offspring and/or never- married adopted/foster children; or by a lone parent with at least one nevermarried child. If there are more than two generations in a household, the CFU is formed from the youngest generation upwards. Individuals not in a CFU are allocated the code of 0. No individual can be assigned to more than one CFU. A code of 99 means unclassifiable.

For further details on the construction of the CFU see E. A. Hammel and P. Laslett. (1974). "Comparing household structure over time and between cultures." Comparative studies in Society and History 16(1): 73-109.

CFUSIZE: Number of people in individuals CFU

CFUSIZE is the number of people within the conjugal family unit to which the individual belongs. It is important to note that no individual within a household can be assigned to more than one CFU. For further details on CFUs, see the documentation for the variable CFU. Individuals not in a CFU are allocated the code of 0. A code of 99 means unclassifiable.

CNTRY gives the country of residence for every person. The codes assigned to each country are those used by the UN Statistics Division, and the IPUMS-International data series.

CNTRYGB: Country within Great Britain

CNTRYGB identifies the country within Great Britain (i.e., England, Scotland, Wales or Islands in the British Seas). These distinctions are not made in CNTRY, which is based on the UN Statistics Division codes and only identifies "Great Britain" as a single unit.

COUNTYGB: County, Britain

COUNTYGB identifies the registration county where the household was enumerated. Registration counties are the highest level sub-national administrative unit. Registration counties are not co-terminus with so-called ancient (or administrative) counties.

The codes are comparable (but not identical) to the codes for county of birth (BPLCTYGB). While Yorkshire is just one county for classifying county of birth, it comprises three separate registration counties. The codes for county of birth incorporate codes for unknown or non-specific responses, which are not included in the registration county codes. COUNTYGB identifies households enumerated in London (established as an administrative county in 1889 from parts of Middlesex, Kent, and Surrey). BPLCTYGB does not distinguish London from other areas of Middlesex, Kent, and Surrey. BPLCTYGB identifies persons born on the island of Sark, but households enumerated on Sark are classified as part of Guernsey in COUNTYGB. Likewise, BPLCTYGB identifies persons born on the Isle of Wight, but households enumerated on the Isle of Wight are classified as part of Hampshire in COUNTYGB.

In some of the samples there were households who indicated a registration county as the military abroad or on British ships of the military abroad. These households are coded within a general "Abroad" category.

Registration districts (DISTGB) are the next geographic unit below registration counties. Registration districts in England and Wales are divided into subdistricts, which are contained in the variable SUBDISTGB. Registration districts in contain parishes. (PARISHGB).

ELDCH: Age of eldest own child in household

ELDCH gives the age of the person's eldest own child (if any) living in the household with her/him. These include all children linked to the person via MOMLOC/MOMRULE or POPLOC/POPRULE. ELDCH includes step-children and adopted children as well as biological children. The highest legitimate age for ELDCH is 98. Persons with no children present are coded 99.

FAMSIZE: Number of own family members in household

FAMSIZE counts the number of the person's own family members living in the household with her/him, including the person her/himself. These include all persons related to the person by blood, adoption, or marriage as indicated by the census forms or inferred from them.

FAMSIZE is constructed from information in RELATE (relationship to head) and from the constructed pointer variables SPLOC, MOMLOC, and POPLOC (location of spouse, mother, and father). The design of FAMSIZE and other constructed variables follows the methods developed for IPUMS-USA.

Note: Users should be aware that in the United States census of 1880, where relationship to the head was not transcribed for non-relatives FAMSIZE may be inaccurate in some cases. Please contact the NAPP staff with information about any erroneous relationships discovered.

Users should consider group quarters status (see GQ) when using FAMSIZE. Family interrelationship variables are not available for group quarters with more than 30 persons.

FAMUNIT: Family unit membership

FAMUNIT indicates to which family within the household a person belongs. If there is only one group of related individuals within the household, all of them will be coded "1"; if there is a second, separate such group listed on the form, all of them will be coded "2", and so on. In other words, primary families and primary individuals are identified in FAMUNIT with a code of "1"; each secondary family or secondary individual receives a higher code.

Family members can be related by direct descent (i.e., parents and children), marriage (i.e., spouses and in-laws), and adoption.

FAMUNIT is constructed from information in RELATE (relationship to head) and from the constructed pointer variables SPLOC, MOMLOC, and POPLOC (location of spouse, mother, and father).

FAMUNIT contains different information than the variable CFU. Whereas CFU indexes "conjugal families", FAMUNIT defines families as any group of related individuals. In the simplest cases - such as a family composed of a head, spouse and child - the CFU and FAMUNIT indices are the same. In more complicated cases, the indices will diverge.

FARM: Farm, NAPP definition

FARM indicates the connection of a household to agriculture. To accommodate differences in census enumeration practices and occupational structure, FARM in NAPP is not constructed in the same way as FARM in the IPUMS.

FARM classifies a household's connections to agriculture into four levels:

1: Nobody in the household indicates any connection with agriculture

2: At least one member of the household is a farmer, and the household's location meets the population [density] threshold.

Farmers are identified by having an occupation in minor group 6-1 (See the OCCHISCO codes). If the only agricultural occupation(s) in the household were husbandmen or cottars (61115), the household did not receive this code. Husbandmen and cottars are found in Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and Iceland, and their residence was not always on a farm.

For all full-count England and Wales datasets and for Scotland 1881, a parish population density threshold of 75 persons per acre was applied. For the two percent Great Britain 1851 sample, a population density threshold of 64 persons per acre was applied. Households with farmers that were in locations with greater population [densities] were not given this code. Parish density information is not available in Scotland 1861, 1871, or 1891. FARM is defined based on occupation alone in these samples.

3: At least one member of the household was an agricultural laborer; or in Norway there was a cottar in the household, who had no other trade.

Agricultural laborers were individuals with an occupation in unit groups 621-626 and 628. (See the codes for OCCHISCO). People with occupations in unit groups 627 (Gardeners) and 629 (Animal care workers) were often not living on farms.

4: Cottars are individuals with the occupational code 61115. In Norway cottars (occupational code 61115) in the household who had a secondary occupation, such as a trade (generally, an occupation from minor group 71 to minor group 94).

9: Anyone who has an "Unknown" occupation is classified in this category.

GQ: Group quarters

GQ classifies all housing units as falling into one of two broad categories: households and group quarters. Group quarters are largely institutions and other group living arrangements, such as rooming houses and military barracks.

Housing units are given one of three codes combining the IPUMS and British rules for identifying group quarters.

IPUMS identifies group quarters as units with 10 or more individuals unrelated to the household head. The British rules for identifying group quarters are that the household has 12 or more people, and the ratio of people unrelated to the head to total household size is > 0.8.

Once a unit has more than 10 people unrelated to the head, it will always be a group quarters under the NAPP definition (GQ = 2 or GQ = 3). Its classification under the British definition depends on the ratio - not the total number - of unrelated members. Thus housing units with large number of unrelated individuals may not be group quarters under the British rule if the ratio of unrelated to total members of the housing unit falls below 0.8.

1: Household with 0-9 persons unrelated to the head. 2: Households with 10 or more persons unrelated to the head, and group quarters under British rule. 3: Households with 10 or more persons unrelated to the head, but not group quarters under British rule. This includes households of 10 and 11 people total with 10 or 11 persons unrelated to the head, and the more diverse cases of households with 12 or more total, and 10 or more unrelated but where the ratio of unrelated to total is less than or equal to 0.8.

Note that large dwellings with multiple family units are classified as group quarters only if they contain 10 or more individuals who are unrelated to all household heads in the dwelling. In most samples, it is difficult to identify how family units that share a dwelling are related to one another. For this reason, we cannot say whether large dwellings with multiple family units are group quarters or the homes of large extended families.

HEADLOC: Location of head in household

HEADLOC is a constructed variable that indicates whether a household head is present in the sample unit and, if so, gives the person number of the head of household.

HHWT: Household weight

HHWT indicates how many households in the population are represented by a given household in a dataset. It is necessary to apply HHWT to produce accurate household-level statistics for the "weighted" NAPP samples: those where the household records in the sample data represent differing numbers of households in the population.

INACTVGB: Adjunct occupational code (Inactive), Britain

This variable was created by the 1881 British census project. This code is an experimental adjunct to the occupational code. The first digit of four is the most useful (and the most reliable). The initial number denotes the type of economic activity carried out by the individual. Codes 1-6 inclusive denote inactivity, code 7 denotes in the labour market, code 8 denotes that the person is retired, and code 9 is for unknown.

The other three numbers in the code are, for those whose code starts with 7 or 8 the three digit occupational code allocated in the coding dictionary. Thus Butcher has an INACTVGB code of 7225 and Retired Butcher had 8225. See the documentation for OCCGB.

The code is based on a variety of information found within the dataset. The main source of information is the occupational string. All occupational entries within the dictionary which do not refer to a current or past working status have also manually been allocated an INACTVGB code. Thus the occupational entry 'Farmer's wife' is given an occupational code of 414 denoting that she is a 'person returned by property, rank etc. and not special occupation' and, additionally in the occupational dictionary, an INACTVGB code of 3700 denoting 'deriving support from the household head', will also have been allocated.

At the first digit level, these codes represent: 1xxx: institutional residents including noninstitutional 'paupers' 2xxx: vagrants, tramps etc. 3xxx: independent means and dependent on household heads 4xxx: foreign residents and students 7xxx: in work 8xxx: past work 9xxx: unclassifiable

It is important to note that there is no clear theoretical construct underpinning these majority of these categories and they should be used with considerable care.

For those in work, 7000 is added to their occupational code and for those who have an occupational entry with an indication of the fact that they used to carry out an occupation will have 8000 added to the occupational code. Therefore for all people with a non-blank entry in the occupation column of the CEB will have been allocated an INACTVGB code. Those people with a blank entry in the occupation column have their INACTVGB code allocated on the basis of their relationship

to the head of the household. It is important to note that if there is any information within the occupational column it takes precedence over the contents of the relationship field. Thus where an occupation is recorded as 'Farmer's wife', but the relationship is 'Servant', the INACTVGB code will be 3700 and not 7056 which would be the replacement value if the occupational entry was blank.

OCCSTRNG: Occupation as transcribed

OCCSTRNG is an alphabetic variable that preserves the transcription of an individual's response to questions about their occupation. Although the various occupation and industry codes preserve significant detail on occupation and industry, much variation exists in the occupational strings.

OCCSTRNG will primarily be of interest to researchers who are linking census data to other sources, or are investigating occupations at a much more detailed level than offered by the various coding schemes.

The collection of occupation information was extensively covered in the instructions to enumerators. Researchers who are interested in OCCSTRNG should also read the enumerator instructions for assistance in interpreting occupational responses.

Because of the size of this variable (30 columns), users should not select this variable unless it is essential for their research. Users should be aware that some responses are truncated at this length.

ORDERGB: Occupational order, Britain

ORDERGB describes the occupational order scheme. It is derived from the Registrar General's 1881 classification. The code is based on the contents of the INACTVGB variable and not the contents of OCCGB. The following table summarizes the reclassification involved.

PARISHGB: Civil parish, Britain

PARISHGB identifies the civil parish in Great Britain where the household was enumerated.

The integration of the 1881 and the 1851 parishes are based solely on parish names. No attempt was made to account for changing geographic boundaries. This fact is especially salient for the 19000's codes, which appear to be 1851 locations that had no name match in 1881. Also, institutions and group quarters with unspecified locations are included in the 90000's category.

PERWT: Person weight

PERWT indicates how many persons in the population are represented by a given person in the dataset. It is necessary to apply PERWT to produce accurate statistics for the "weighted" NAPP samples, specifically in those where the person records in the sample data represent differing numbers of person in the population.

POPLOC: Fathers location in household

POPLOC is a constructed variable that indicates whether the person's father lived in the same household and, if so, gives the person number of the father (see PERNUM).

POPLOC makes it easy for researchers to link the characteristics of children and their (probable) fathers.

The method by which probable child-father links are identified is described in POPRULE.

User Caution: POPLOC identifies social relationships (such as stepfather and adopted father) as well as biological relationships.

PRMFAMSZ: Size of primary family

PRMFAMSZ is the size of the primary, or first, family in the household. It is the FAMSIZE of the first family unit (FAMUNIT) recorded in the household.

PRMFAMSZ and FAMSIZE are constructed from information in RELATE (relationship to head of household) and from the constructed pointer variables SPLOC, MOMLOC, and POPLOC (location of spouse, mother, and father).

Note: The NAPP constructed variables are subject to future improvement. In particular, users should be aware that in the United States census of 1880, where relationship to the head was not transcribed for non-relatives, FAMSIZE and PRMFAMSZ may be inaccurate in some cases.

QAGEGB: Age inferred

QAGEGB denotes whether the creators of the Great Britain database altered the age as originally recorded.

QMARSTGB: Marital status inferred

QMARSTGB denotes whether the creators of the database altered the marital status as originally recorded.

The program makes the following corrections: First it alters ambiguous marital status. Then, those with an unknown marital status who are aged under 26 are assumed to be single and MARST is set to 6 (single), and QMARSTGB set to 1. If they are recorded as being a child or step child of the head of household, regardless of age, they are assumed to be single, and QMARSTGB is set to 1.

If an individual has a relationship to household head of wife or husband and a marital status of either single or unknown than their marital status is changed to married (MARST=1) and QMARSTGB set to 1.

If an individual has a marital status of married (MARST=1) yet is aged less than 16 then their marital status is changed to single (MARST=6) and QMARSTGB is set to 1.

Those individuals whose relationship is given as wife or husband and whose age is less or equal to 15 and whose marital status is given as ever- married (MARST is 1-5) then age is reset to missing and QAGEGB set to 2.

If an individual has a marital status of married (MARST=1) yet is aged less than 16 then their marital status is changed to single (MARST=6) and QMARSTGB is set to 1.

QOCCGB: INACTVGB altered by programming

QOCCGB denotes whether the creators of the Great Britain database used variables other than the occupational code and information on retirement status to modify the INACTVGB code, based on logical consistency with information available in the relationship to household head variable. Both codes 1 and 2 signify that the occupation status has been altered, one of them is changed based on the relationship to the household head field and the other is changed not based on the relationship to the household head field.

QRELGB: Relationship inferred

QRELGB denotes whether the creators of the database altered the relationship to household head as originally transcribed.

The following outline of relationship classification in the British census details why altering the transcribed relationships was sometimes necessary.

During the transcription process the LDS made a number of revisions to the relationship to head of household field. These alterations impinge on the manner in which the relationship to head of household has been coded.

For the purposes of the LDS' data entry program every household had to have a head of household. If the original census enumerator's book (CEB) contained a household (usually defined as being between a pair of double slashes) whose head was not defined as such that word should be added after the relationship as enumerated. e.g., a family which contained a woman and two children, where the woman was enumerated as being a 'wife' would become the head, i.e. WIFE (HEAD). A problem concerning consistency is compounded by the diligence of some enumerators. Consider a family containing a husband (temporarily absent) who lives with his wife and 20-year old son. One enumerator may have considered the son the head of household and enumerated him as such; another might consider the mother the head and enumerate her as such.

Exactly how the transcribers would approach this problem is unclear. If it was necessary to establish a head they were told to use five pieces of information within the CEBs to assist them in their choices:

schedule number change of address inhabited strokes household strokes family relationships

Note, however, it is impossible to check this process internally because schedule numbers as they appeared in the CEB were not included in the machine-readable version. Transcribers were instructed not to resolve unusual relationships, rather to give them as enumerated with clarifications written in single brackets. They were categorically instructed to leave the original as enumerated if there was any problem. There is evidence to suggest that this was not carried out consistently.

If any member of a household was enumerated before the head of household transcribers were instructed to leave it as the enumerator recorded it but adding a note saying that this had occurred.

If a household consisted of co-resident family groups and the CEBs gave correct relationships to the head of household (not head of family) the original was not to be altered, for example:

However, it is unclear precisely what would have happened if this family was enumerated as:

What would happen? One of two possibilities could be expected. The first would have been to alter the relationships to those as stated in the first example; the second would be to make Robert Jones's relationship HEAD (SON IN LAW) and leave the other relationships as they are.

These problems are compounded when considering household 'inmates', i.e., lodgers and boarders.

Where distinct households contained only lodgers the first one listed, regardless of age or sex would have the relationship head added as the relationship to the head of household in brackets. If a lodger or boarder was identified as such in the relationship column, and it was clear to the transcriber that s/he resided within that household, the additional head should not have been added, even if there was a single stroke in the CEB. It is unclear on what grounds this rule was applied, though surname and occupation are likely to give clues.

When lodgers or boarders were living with their own families and were given relationships to suggest this by the enumerator, the transcribers were instructed to ensure that one of the group should be identified as the head, for example:

When lodgers or boarders were living with their own families and were not given relationships to suggest this by the enumerator, the transcribers were instructed not to make one of them the head of household. Note that transcribers were told to ignore the occupations or names of people only to use the information given in the relationship to head of household column.

When relationships within families were given incorrectly to the head of household, transcribers were instructed to add the correct relationship within brackets:

It is perhaps interesting to note that the LDS generally choose the eldest person, regardless of gender as head, rather than the eldest male, the latter probably being the chosen practice of most enumerators. Also, for example:

The transcribers were instructed to transcribe the relationships as enumerated, however the evaluators were instructed not to alter obvious abbreviations. For example, if the CEB says 'Daughter' and it was transcribed as Daur, it will be found in the machine-readable version as DAUR. A single exception to this was the head of household: whatever was found in the CEBs the machine-readable version will contain HEAD. (It is on this basis that we believe that the contents of the HOUSESTD field were allocated to Self or otherwise.)

What these rules boil down to is the possibility that there are two possible relationships which can be used in the coding and reformatting program. Depending on the circumstances the different relationships will be used.

There are three basic principles behind this coding scheme:

1) that the trailing digit of the code denotes the gender of the individual, as follows:

Thus a male head is 11, a female head 12 and a head of indeterminate gender 10. (The exception to this rule is those people whose relationship code ends in 199 which is a form used for an undetermined relation.)

2) The codes fall into a number of distinct ranges:

The residential kin codes are grouped reflecting the vertical and lateral relationships to the head of the household.

The codes for familial inmates and servants are applied on the same basis as the head's residential kin. For example:

There are two problems with the data as produced by the LDS regarding relationship information. These are allowed for with the third principle.

3) Wherever additional information has been added in the transcription phase an attempt is made to make it useable.

To account for these alterations and 'corrections' a second code has been added to assist in family and household analysis. The basic principle behind this code is to show the 'real' relationship to the head of the household. Thus the relationship 'Son (Head)' when found in the data is assumed to mean that this individual is the son of an absent head of household and for the purposes of the LDSs exercise this person has become the head of household. In this case the first code is 31 and the second code is 11 [male head].

This secondary information, in brackets, is, with two exceptions always coded in the second code position. The first exception refers to the possibility that the information in the brackets has the same meaning as that without the brackets or if the information without the brackets is not a relationship; the second concerns those that are only present in brackets, thus:

A different principle is used to classify those who are related to inmates. Thus:

The last possibility has been altered to deal with problems which may occur when inmates (especially boarders) are also kin.

A single caveat must be made here. Based on the (potentially unwarranted) assumption that when visitors have a relationship they have that relationship to the head of household. Thus:

Note that for analytical purposes, in the second group the second code can override the assumption that the person is the son to the head of household by making him a visitor. The third person can be ignored because its primary code is in the 2xxx group and there is no secondary code.

Similarly:

Notes: (1) Kin takes precedence (2) Treated as in brackets (3) Not 4125 as per "addition rules" (4) As per the first example (5) Kin takes precedence, but the program will decide about the boarding status.

Note: also where the code is in the 5000-7000 range and there is additional information on kinship the default value is used, so the addition rule can be implemented, thus:

Further (minor) rules:

If only information in brackets it is coded in the first position. If the string has 'no relationship' followed by brackets then 'no onship' is ignored. If the string repeats information then only one is coded. If brackets occur before other information then it is treated as after. If the string contains information on kin and on an adoptive onship, kin takes precedence... but in other cases where potentially multiple kin the 'nearest' to the head is coded.

QSEXGB: Sex inferred

QSEXGB denotes whether the originally-recorded sex was altered by the original data producers.

The program checks that each individual has consistently gendered variables, i.e., someone whose first name is female and whose relationship is feminine should also be recorded as female. A dictionary of first names which has been checked manually has been constructed to test whether first names are masculine or feminine-initials are excluded-and the relationship code, which is often gender specific, i.e. wife can only be female, are used to test the entry in the sex variable. If both first name and relationship indicate a different gender to that in the sex variable, the sex variable is altered. If there is still a problem, i.e., the relationship is not gender specific (i.e., head) then the sex is altered in the following ways;

For those people where the relationship to head of household is gender- specific, alter the sex if relationship and first name refer to a different sex than the sex variable. For those people where the relationship to head of household is gender- specific, alter the sex if relationship and first name refer to the same sex and the sex variable is unrecorded.

RELATE: Relationship to household head

RELATE describes an individual's relationship to the head of household. This variable is largely compatible with the IPUMS variable RELATE, though some changes have been made.

The relationship codes are divided into two categories-relatives (codes 1-10) and non-relatives (codes 11-12). The codes for relatives are self- explanatory. The non-relative codes are divided into three groups: "Partner, friend, visitor", roughly described as persons who do not pay or work for their accommodations (unless they share ownership); "Other non-relatives", including those persons paying or working for accommodations; and "Institutional inmates".

RELATEI: Relationship to household head, IPUMS-International codes

RELATEI describes an individual's relationship to the head of household. This variable is compatible with the IPUMS International variable RELATE, though not all codes available in the IPUMSI

data are represented in the NAPP data.

Compared to RELATE, RELATEI preserves less detail on some rare classes of step, adopted, in-law, and multiple-generational relationships.

Specifically, the codes for grandparents and aunts/uncles in RELATEI do not differentiate step-, adopted, or in-law grandparents. Similarly, the code for aunt/uncle does not differentiate beyond the first generation of aunt/uncle. Additional detail on these relationships is available in RELATE and in the unharmonized source variables.

There are five general categories for the first digit of RELATEI. The first four are for the head or relatives of the head, and the fifth is for non-relatives of the head. The general categories are largely comparable across samples. There are some discrepancies, however, and the specific subcategories within each general code vary considerably.

SERVANTS: Number of servants in household

SERVANTS is a constructed variable that indicates the number of servants in the household, who are not related to the household head but are likely to be working in the household.

SERVANTS was constructed uniformly for all NAPP samples, based on information in RELATE and occupation (OCCHISCO or OCC50US). Specifically, in all countries SERVANTS counts the number of people in the household who meet the following conditions: 1) their relationship to head was non-relative and their occupation indicated they were a servant; 2) an occupation response

other than servant but a relationship code of servant; 3) an occupation of servant and a surname different from the head of household (for samples that lack relationship-to-head information).

The variable SERVANTS is top-coded at 99.

SPLOC: Spouses location in household

SPLOC is a constructed variable that indicates whether the person's spouse lived in the same household and, if so, gives the person number (PERNUM) of the spouse. SPLOC makes it easy for researchers to link the characteristics of (probable) spouses.

The method by which probable spouse-spouse links are identified is described in SPRULE.

Family interrelationship variables were not constructed in households containing 30 or more residents. In addition, pointers were not constructed for households containing multiple individuals with the relationship "spouse of head" unless the household could be subdivided into multiple subhouseholds each with a person identified as a household or family head. These limitations were necessary because of the uncertainty of family interrelationships in these households and members affected households receive an SPLOC code of 0.

SPRULE: Rule for linking spouse

SPRULE explains the criteria by which the NAPP variable SPLOC linked the person to a probable spouse.

NAPP establishes spouse-spouse links according to four basic rules, and SPRULE gives the number of the rule that applied to the link in question.

SPRULE works the same way for all countries. In all countries both partners are required to be

age 12 and older and to either have a marital status of married or be the unmarried partner of the household head (see MARST and RELATE). In addition, both partners were required to share the same surname, except when linking heads to spouses or in the Scandinavian samples where SURSIM does not capture family relationships (e.g. patronymic surnames in Norway and non-reporting of child surnames in Sweden). In some samples, however, we were compelled to customize the links beyond what could be implemented more generally.

The codes for SPRULE are as follows. A lower-numbered rule (greater than 0) takes precedence over a higher numbered rule. All relationship pairings are not available in every sample. Additional conditions were added to the rules for some samples.

STEPMOM: Probable step/adopted mother

STEPMOM indicates whether a person's mother, as identified by MOMLOC, was most probably not the person's biological mother. Non-zero values of STEPMOM explain why it is probable that the person's mother was a step- or adopted mother. A value of 0 indicates no likely stepmother because (1) the mother identified in MOMLOC was probably the biological mother or (2) there is no mother of this person present in the household. Only persons under age 19 are linked to their mothers.

The codes for STEPMOM are as follows:

0 = Biological mother or no mother of this person present in household. 1 = Age difference between mother and child was less than 12 or greater than 54 years. 2 = Link was established only because the mother was married to father. 3 = Child explicitly identified relationship as stepchild. 5 =Child explicitly identified as adopted.

A value of 0 indicates no likely stepfather because (1) the father identified in POPLOC was probably the biological father or (2) there is no father of this person present in the household. Only persons underage 19 are linked to their fathers.

The codes for STEPPOP are as follows:

Modern National grid referencing is in the form of two letters followed by 4 digits. By checking existing clusters it was found that the second and third digits of their grid reference corresponded to the first and second digits of the modern National grid reference, and that the sixth and seventh digits of their grid reference corresponded to the third and fourth digits of the modern grid reference. Consulting a descriptive manual of Ordnance Survey maps it was found that before the letters now forming part of the reference came into use there had been a system that used two digit numbers. The first of these digits became the first digit of this variable, while the second of these numbers became the fifth digit of the variable grid reference of the cluster.

GB51A416: Adjunct occupational code (Inactive), 1851 census

This variable provides the adjunct occupational codes. Essentially, it is the first number of the set of four which is presently of use. The initial number denotes the type of economic activity carried out by the individual. Codes 1–6 inclusive denote inactivity, code 7 denotes in the labor market, code 8 denotes that the person is retired, and code 9 is for unknown. The other three numbers in the code are, for those whose code starts with 7 or 8 the three digit occupational code allocated in the coding dictionary. Thus Butcher has an adjunct occupational code of 7225 and Retired Butcher had 8225.

The code is based on a variety of information found within the dataset. The main source of information is the occupational string. All occupational entries within the dictionary which do not refer to a current or past working status have also manually been allocated an adjunct occupational code. Thus the occupational entry 'Farmer's wife' is given an occupational code of 414 denoting that she is a 'person returned by property, rank etc. and not special occupation' and, additionally in the occupational dictionary, an adjunct occupational code of 3700 denoting 'deriving support from the household head', will also have been allocated. For those in work, 7000 is added to their occupational code and for those who have an occupational entry with an indication of the fact that they used to carry out an occupation will have 8000 added to the occupational code. Therefore for all people with a non-blank entry in the occupation column of the census enumeration form will have been allocated an adjunct occupation column have their adjunct occupational code allocated on the basis of their relationship to the head of the household. It is important to note that if there is any information within the occupational

column it takes precedence over the contents of the relationship field. Thus where an occupation is recorded as 'Farmer's wife', but the relationship is 'Servant', the final adjunct occupational code will remain 3700 and not 7056 which would be the replacement value if the occupational entry was blank

The transcripts of the British 1851 census are from the 2% sample, transcribed by a team under Professor Michael Anderson at Edinburgh. The inclusion of institutional population in the 1851 sample was created by Professor Michael Anderson. According to Anderson "Institutions were sampled by treating all the institutional populations as if they were one continuous list and then systematically selecting twenty individuals from each successive one thousand names. Where institutions included families, special arrangements were made; in these cases the sample was drawn so as to include all members of families the first member of which appeared before the twentieth individual, and to exclude members of families where only the later members appeared within a block of twenty names. Proceeding in these ways, 980 separate 'data clusters' were identified, either directly from the published Reports or, in most cases, by tediously counting the enumeration books and selecting the fiftieth in each stratum sequence".

However, some inconsistencies remain and programming altered some of the values in the institutional population so that the 1881 and 1851 census are comparable. The four variables that help define the institutional location of an individual are, rectype (record type) allocated by the data parsing program; second the address (GB51A007) given in the enumerators' books; third the relationship (GB51A411) between the number of related kin within the household and fourth the size of the household.

The combination of these variables can be summarized as follows:

If the household is not already defined as an institution, has more than 20 residents of whom 10 or more have a relationship to head of household which are 'miscellaneous' (i.e., not kin, not inmates, not boarders, not lodgers, not servants and not visitors) then the household shall be defined as an institution.

If the household is not already defined as an institution and there are more than 20 residents, more than two-thirds are institutional inmates, household inmates, family inmates or servants, then the household shall be defined as an institution.

If the household is not already defined as an institution and there is a valid 'institution-word' in the address, there are more than six residents and the ratio of kin to non-kin is greater than 0.8 then the household is redefined as an institution.

If the household is defined as an institution, there is no valid institution word in the address, there are less than 24 residents and the ratio of kin to non-kin is less than 0.8 then the household is redefined as an ordinary household.

If the household is defined as an ordinary household and there is a valid 'vesselword' then the household is redefined as a vessel.

For each of these alterations a different new record type is created which serves the purpose of a check variable. For example, the first three of these types would result in the variable instit being set to 4, which indicates that it would have been 1 had not the program altered it.
