The Enumerator will include in one Statutory Declaration Return (Form R) all the Schools in his Accountmental Assurant (Form in ) and non-cohools in his District, giving the names of the Schools in the 3rd column and altering the word "Localities" to "Schools" in the heading, also the declaration at foot of Form B to suit the circumstances of the case. The Ecumerator will further proceed in the manner shown in paragraph 52 of the "Instruc-tions to Enumerators" By order of the Commissioners.
